Living Beyond Hurt

You can live today in such a manner that you will never be hurt again. Does that sound impossible? It is the truth! You can live outside of the hurts of the soul and the hurts of this world. This opportunity, this way of living comes to us when we choose to be a Kingdom person, someone who desires to serve Christ with all of the heart, soul, mind and strength. Look at Matthew 5:12,

"Rejoice and be exceedingly glad, for great is your reward in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you."

The word for rejoice here is the same Greek word from which we get our word for grace! Grace produces joy and delight! Does it not? That's what the word CHARIS literally means. We rejoice and grace comes! So when difficult things arise before you because of your love and commitment to Jesus, don't retaliate. That's exactly what the devil wants you to do! No, no! Why not negate, defeat, and override every negative assignment by rejoicing instead? Great grace will then come!
